#### AGENDA:

- 1) Call to Order: Meeting was called to order by H. Pulliam at 7:03 pm.
- 2) <u>Proof of Posting</u>: C. Narveson attested to proof of posting.
- 3) <u>Approve August 20, 2020, Parks Commission Minutes:</u> H. Pulliam moved to approve the August 20, 2020 Parks minutes, J. Neton 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion passes.
- 4) <u>Public Comments</u>: D. Emmerton notified the committee of a field with a professional ice skating rink she saw in Ohio that was nicely appointed with skates, a compressor, bumpers, etc. that could be used by groups & the public. C. Narveson informed the group of the County NN relocation proposal by a committee that includes Friends of the New Glarus Woods. Grants could be used to support this project.
- 5) Well Water Testing Program: H. Pulliam suggested partnering with UW-Extension on their Well Water Testing program by sending a mailer in addition to the one being sent by Extension. This has been done with great success in the town in the past. M. Pernitz made a motion to send out a mailer about the program & additional workshops in person or via Zoom, D. Emmerton 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion passes.
- 6) Prairie Burn at Bluebird Ridge: H. Pulliam suggested an April prairie burn at Bluebird Ridge with the assistance of Tom Mitchell of the Prairie Enthusiasts. The park was already partially burned, but this could complete it. It was also proposed to ask Ron Roesslein to remove box elder trees from the west end of the park, along with prickly ash that needs to be sheared or sprayed. Committee members will mark the trees that need to be removed. No motion was necessary as this project was approved at a prior meeting.
- 7) Community Art Project by New Glarus Public Library: The committee considered promoting the NGPL Community Art Project by putting a copy of the flyer in the water testing mailer. Asking for email addresses in the mailer was also mentioned.
- 8) <u>Village of New Glarus Request about Financial Support for Parks-Related Projects</u>: C. Narveson was approached by village members about financial support of parks & recreation-related projects at Glarner Park & Hoesly Pond. The committee would like to have more information from the village before entertaining a motion.

- 9) Discussion of Trail Grants: M. Pernitz & C. Narveson updated the committee on the trail projects/grants that were started in 2020.
- 10) <u>Schedule Next Meeting</u>: The next parks meeting is planned for Wednesday, April 21, which will be held in person if possible.
- 11) <u>Adjourn:</u> D. Emmerton made a motion to adjourn the meeting, M. French 2<sup>nd</sup>. Motion passes. Meeting adjourned at 9 pm.

#### How safe is your drinking water?

According to the University of Wisconsin Center for Watershed Science and Education, <u>WI Well Water Quality Viewer (uwsp.edu)</u>, 24% of private wells tested in Green County show bacterial contamination. Of those, 10% have tested positive for E. coli. Also, 18% of Green County's tested wells show nitrate levels above the safe limit of 10 parts million and 46% exhibit some level of contamination by the pesticide Atrazine.

The Wisconsin DNR recommends that well owners have their water tested at least once a year. Over the next few months, the Green County Towns of Adams, New Glarus, Washington, and York will be partnering with the Green County Extension Office to offer a complete drinking water testing program. By the time residents see this notice, they should have received a postcard from the Extension Office, detailing the prices for the tests that are being offered. Town of New Glarus residents will also receive a flier that includes this information and the times, dates and locations for bottle pick-up and sample delivery.

Please note that to encourage folks to fully protect themselves and their families, the Town of New Glarus will enter New Glarus well owners who order the full battery of water tests into a drawing to win one of <a href="three">three</a> \$100 cash prizes or one of <a href="four">four</a> \$25 cash prizes. Also, after receiving their test results, residents can attend a free virtual educational program (to be held on June 29, 2021), where they can speak with a UW-Extension Groundwater specialist about those results.

# How safe is your drinking water?

The Wisconsin DNR recommends you test your private well at least once a year for contamination.

Your water can contain harmful bacteria, viruses, and chemicals even if it looks, tastes, and smells fine.

Package	What each package includes	Which wells should be tested
<b>Homeowners</b> \$55	Coliform bacteria*, Nitrate*, Chloride, Hard- ness, Alkalinity, pH, Saturation Index	All Wells:  ✓ This is the basic package, perform this set of tests if you are unsure which package to perform.  ✓ Includes the two most important tests to perform regularly on a well (bacteria and nitrate).
Metals \$52	Arsenic*, Lead*, Copper*, Iron, Zinc, Calcium, Magnesium, Manganese*, Sodium*, Potassium, Sulfate*	Consider this test package if:  ✓ You've never had your well tested for arsenic.  ✓ Previous tests indicated the presence of arsenic.  ✓ Your plumbing system has components that contain copper and/or lead.  ✓ You have red or brown staining from your water.
<b>DACT Screen</b> \$33	Tests for a breakdown component of atrzine type pesticides*	Consider this package if:  ✓ Your well is within 1/4 mile of agricultural fields where corn has been grown.  ✓ Previous tests indicated elevated nitrate likely associated with fertilizer use.

\*Indicates a test that measures potential health related contaminants.
