PARK COMMISSION MEETING March 20, 2024

- **1. Call to Order.** The meeting was called to order by Chair Pulliam at 6:00 pm.
- 2. Proof of Posting. Proof of posting was provided by Streiff.
- **3. Approve Minutes from February 21, 2024.** Motion to approve the minutes of February 21, 2024 by French, second by Pertzborn, motion approved.
- **4. Public Comments.** Narveson reported that the Town of Exeter donated 2 surplus porta potties which are now at the Park site.
- 5. Update on Community Input Night and Focus Group Meetings. Pulliam reported that there was a good turnout at the Community Input night with over 40 in attendance. Approximately 10 people attended each of the 4 focus group meetings held on 2 consecutive nights. Vierbicher is now compiling the information and will provide a report at the April 17 Parks meeting. At subsequent meetings, we will discuss a preliminary park plan including what types of improvements will be included and where geographically they will be located. Completion will be done in phases with construction of the Town garage and restoration of the southern lowland being the first priority. Plans will be made to make the Park accessible.

Pulliam will advise Cheryl Housley of the DNR that we are not far enough along in the planning stage to pursue any grants during this cycle but should be in a better position to do so next year.

We will look for volunteer opportunities for high school students as we proceed to help them satisfy their volunteer requirements.

- **6. Report from Signage Study Committee.** Pernitz reported that he and French met and decided to wait until building was further along to determine the type and number of signs needed.
- **7. Update on Easements for Trail Along Hwy 39.** Narveson reported that he has had difficulty obtaining easements from the necessary property owners on both the north and south sides of Hwy. 39. The deadline to complete the trail is approaching so if we can't get the necessary easements we will have to reject the DNR grant and consider building the trail at a later time.
- **8. Discuss Outreach to 4-H Clubs per Ashley Haffner's Comments in Focus Group.** Haffner is involved in a 4-H Club based in Monticello. 4-H is no longer just farming activities; it also includes cake decorating, building bird houses, archery, air

- guns, etc. There may be activities in developing the park property that we could solicit their help. There was discussion about also partnering with FFA, shop classes and the elderly for park projects.
- **9. Discuss Asking Scouts to Help Sort Trees for Delivery.** Pulliam reported that we ordered trees from Sustainable Wildlife Habitat in Cambridge for the Town's annual tree sale. We haven't heard yet when they will be available for pick-up, but typically it's in April. Pulliam mentioned that we will need help sorting the trees and asked Narveson to contact the Boy Scouts to see if they would help. Ruschman reported that he knows some high school students who would make good volunteers and that he will contact them.
- **10. Discuss and Possibly Approve Proposed Amendments to 2024 Park Commission Budget.** Pulliam reported that he and Town clerk Wright made some changes to the wording in the 2024 Parks Budget but that the numbers have remained the same. Motion to approve the revised budget by Narveson, second by Pernitz, motion approved.
- 11. Discuss and Possibly Approve Proposed Changes to Chapter 204 Town Commissions and Boards. Pernitz noted that there are a number of items in the current ordinance that are inconsistent with Town practice, worded poorly and/or are in need of change. He will prepare a revision for the April or May meeting.
- 12. Discuss Potential Workshops for 2024. A discussion took place that with the planning of the new park, we may not have time to offer workshops this year. An exception would be if we had a workshop on how to perform a task, and then coupled it with a workday for the new park; for example, how to pick prairie seeds. Grenzow is a member of The Prairie Enthusiasts (TPE) and spoke to Tom Mitchell who is the site steward for most of their properties. Several properties have wet areas and we could pick seeds there under the supervision of TPE for use in the southern portion of the Park. Mitchell recommended that the Town purchase seeds for three short grasses: side oats gramma, prairie dropseed, and little blue stem. Then he recommended inter-seed with non-grass seeds collected from TPE's properties. There are always extra seeds from a few species at the end of the season, but the bulk of the seed would have to be collected by NG Park volunteers in conjunction with TPE's seed collecting work parties. Collecting seed outside of these work parties is strictly prohibited. Seed picking takes place between May–November, depending upon species.

Bluebird Ridge was burned this spring by TPE. The Bluebird Ridge burn was probably the most complete burn yet at this site. Unfortunately, the central oak savanna has been taken over by dogwood and will require a major cut-and-treat effort. Pulliam reported that we received a quote from Indigenous Restoration of \$3,000 to do this work.

13. Schedule Next Meeting, April 17, 2024, at 4:30 PM (Town of New Glarus Annual Meeting is at 6 PM).

Pulliam reported that Dana Emmerton has resigned because of time constraints. Pulliam will recommend that the alternate, Pertzborn, be appointed to fill this position. **14. Adjourn.** Motion to adjourn by Pernitz, second by Ruschman, motion approved. Meeting adjourned at 7:15 pm.

Five zones have been identified and separated into manageable phases of park infrastructure, restoration and program development. Stages with each zone consist of 2-5 acres of restoration and/or development. A preliminary financial cost analysis of each stage can be found on the page entitled "Concept Plan #1 - Preliminary Cost Schedule". Phasing and stages were determined by Town goals, implementation of programming (i.e. trail systems & feature areas) and a logical phase-out of agricultural activity.


















FEATURE AREAS







Concept Plan #1 - Future Feature Area

A path of navigation.


An experience across landform.

The identity of a place.

The driftless landform demands to be experienced. This experience starts with the road to the Town Garage and future Town Hall. A path of navigation that curves with the land allows visitors to slow down and signals their arrival in a unique place; one that is rooted in local identity and respects the sensuous nature of the landform.

The new road shall be designed to maneuver visitors along the curvature of each ridge it traverses. Future plantings along the road shall integrate with the environmental restoration theme of the Community Park, highlighting heritage to trees, plants and local materials while camouflaging the Town Garage area.



Concept Plan #1 - Road Infrastructure & Seeding Plan














Concept Plan #1 - Site Wide Trails Town of New Glarus, WI April 17th, 2024






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Concept Plan #1 - West Trails Town of New Glarus, WI April 17th, 2024



Concept Plan #1 - East Trails Town of New Glarus, WI April 17th, 2024














Concept Plan #1 - South Trails Town of New Glarus, WI April 17th, 2024



Below is a forwarded message from Groundswell Conservancy illustrating their ongoing restoration process which is similar to that proposed for NG Parkland. I have contacted BJ Byers at Groundswell to get details on their farmland prep prior to prairie planting. Note, they are receiving some seeds from the DNR, Southern Wisconsin Bird Alliance, and now also self sourcing. I will check with the DNR SNA Volunteer Coordinators in our area, who request assistance from The Prairie Enthusiasts (TPE); at Yellowstone Lake State Park, York/Marbleseed SNA (6 miles west of NG Parkland), and Gap Church SNA; with seed collecting and spreading. Southern Wisconsin Bird Alliance (formerly Madison Audubon) donated the Common Milkweed seeds to Jason, that were offered up in one of their newsletters.

TPE burned at Bluebird Ridge last week Wednesday. The attached photo was taken from Todd Argall's back porch. This was probably the most complete burn yet at this site. Unfortunately, the central oak savanna has been taken over by dogwood and will require a major cut-and-treat effort.

Following the burn, I spoke with Tom Mitchell, the site steward for the majority of our TPE Chapter's properties. He recommended that the Town purchase seeds for three short grasses (side oats gramma, prairie dropseed, and little bluestem), and then inter-seed with non grass seeds collected from TPE's properties. He indicated there is always extra seed of a few species at the end of the season, with the species varying each season. However, the bulk of seed would have to be collected by NG Parkland volunteers, and only in conjunction with TPE's seed collecting work parties. Collecting seed outside these work parties is strictly prohibited.

Jasmine, will need to get your seed recommendations for the two low lying parcels, since I believe all but one of the TPE properties are dryer landscapes? But still may be able to locate seed sources on TPE property?

Frank, we planted more prairie!

Groundswell's Westport Prairie is a 227-acre wildlife area east of Waunakee that is open to the public. In the middle of it, Wisconsin DNR owns the 14-acre glacial drumlin as a State Natural Area. The drumlin is home to over 100 plant species and is a prime example of a healthy shortgrass prairie. This prairie is only a small part of what used to be the Empire Prairie, that covered up to 150,000 acres in Dane and Columbia Counties.

When Groundswell first purchased the land surrounding the State Natural Area, most of the land was farmed. Scattered around were a few small remnant prairies just a couple of acres in size. These prairies are steep, rocky, and impossible to farm. That's why they remain today.

Groundswell has a goal of turning all of the farmland (over 200 acres) into native prairie, and we're doing well! Every year, we take more than 5 acres of farmland out of use and plant it to native flowers and grasses. We use seed collected on-site and from other remnant prairies in the area. This type of prairie planting is called "local genotype restoration" because we use seeds from the local area.

From May to November of each year, we collect prairie seeds with the help of volunteers, interns, conservation crews, and a part-time seed collector that we hire in the fall. We also get seeds donated from the Wisconsin DNR as well as from Southern Wisconsin Bird Alliance.

In winter, when it's snowy, we sow all the seeds collected during the year and start planning for the next year's planting.

A map showing Groundswell's plantings over the years

Our most recent planting from this winter (listed as '2023' on the map) was a historic planting. It was the largest yet at Westport Prairie, covering 6.5 acres. Also, it connects two remnant prairies that used to be one but were separated over time due to farming (the pink remnant prairie to the south with the DNR-owned area in blue to the north).

With each prairie that we plant our seed source grows. This means the size of our plantings will also grow. Next year, we plan to plant 7.5 acres, and 9.5 acres the year after that. Piece by piece, our goal is to bring back a lost landscape by creating habitat that will live on the landscape forever.
